

Royal Decree Issued under Provisions in the Revenue Code Relating to the Exemption of Revenue (No. 266), B.E. 2536 (1993)

Translation

BHUMIBOL ADULYADEJ REX.

Given on the 27th day of August B.E. 2536

Being the 48th year of the Present Reign

His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej has been graciously pleased to proclaim that:

Whereas it is appropriate to exempt duty stamp for the Export-Import Bank of Thailand;

By virtue of provisions in Section 175 of the Constitution of the Kingdom of Thailand and Section 3 of the Revenue Code as amended by the Act Amending Revenue Code (No. 10) B.E. 2496;

Be it, therefore, enacted by His Majesty the King as follows:

Section 1

This Royal Decree shall be called "Royal Decree Issued under Provisions in the Revenue Code Relating to the Exemption of Revenue (No. 266), B.E. 2536 (1993)".

Section 2

This Royal Decree shall come into force on the date following its promulgation in the Government Gazette.

Section 3

Add the following as (21) of Section 6 of the Royal Decree Issued under Provisions in the Revenue Code Relating to the Exemption of Revenue (No. 10) B.E. 2500, as amended in the Royal Decree Issued under Provisions in the Revenue Code Relating to the Exemption of Revenue (No. 259) B.E. 2535.

"(21) Export-Import Bank of Thailand".
